Judicial orders are created and entered by a judge in circuit courts.



Collects and distributes child support payments made by income withholding.



Free program to provide child support services to all families.



The only way to change/terminate a court order is the entry of another court order, which is a modification.



Payments can be made directly to the SDU by the paying parent.



Establish paternity, locate a parent, enforce and collect payment actions.



A \$36 fee may be assessed annually per order, which is paid to the Circuit Clerk and does not apply to the case balance.



Keeps track of payments made, not the balances owed and does not issue or modify orders.



Assist with medical insurance, modifications, and collect past due balances.



Having this type of order does not mean you have a case with Child Support Services.



Making payments through the SDU does not mean you have a case with Child Support Services.



Keeps track of balances to determine any past child support due.

Circuit Clerk orders and making SDU payments **DOES NOT** mean you have a case with Child Support Services, **ENROLL TODAY!**
